From the Pastor's Study

A Message From Casey FitzGerald A Time of Transition

A s Ecclesiastes 3 proclaims, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." At Westminster, the past few months have been a time of transition as we prepare for the beginning of April and the arrival of our new associate pastor, Whitney Fauntleroy, and the return of Patrick Hunnicutt from sabbatical. It has been a time of giving thanks for what has been, and a time of hopefulness for what is becoming. Along the way, we've had many step up to help with the transition, especially in youth ministry. I am deeply thankful for the commitment of the youth advisors in carrying the youth ministry through this in-between time. We are ready to receive Whitney with excitement and openness. I am grateful for the warm welcome already extended to Whitney during her candidating weekend, I know she is, too.

As we prepare for our new associate pastor configuration, I thought it might be helpful to include brief descriptions of the associate pastor roles moving forward:

Whitney Fauntleroy, Associate Pastor for Youth and Young Adults
Whitney will be responsible for all ministries pertaining to youth and their
families, ministry to young adults (20s-30s single/married without children),
and will have general pastoral responsibilities for the entire congregation.

Casey FitzGerald, Associate Pastor for Christian Formation

Casey will be responsible for oversight of and visioning for Christian Formation (previously referred to ask Christian Education), including children, youth, and adult education/formation. Her administrative responsibilities will include supervision and support of staff for Adult Education, Children's Ministry, Youth Ministry, Children's Music, and the Weekday Preschool. Casey will continue to have general pastoral responsibilities for the entire congregation.

Patrick Hunnicutt, Associate Pastor for Mission and Pastoral Care
Patrick will be responsible for the mission visioning and programming
of the church, including staffing the Local, National, and International
Missions committees, as well as the Pastoral Care Team. His
administrative responsibilities will include supervision of staff for Pastoral
Care and Congregational Life. Patrick will continue to have general
pastoral responsibilities for the entire congregation.

In many ways, we are entering a season of new life—of new and renewed energies for the ministries at Westminster. What a gift it is to serve alongside all of you.

Here's a quiz. Which will help you live longer?

- 1. Loading up on anti-oxidant supplements
- 2. Doing something to help others.

As this is a column on getting involved, I'm sure you guessed that number 2 is the correct answer and you are right. A recent study from China (where an aging population gobbles up anti-oxidant supplements) showed that taking large doses of antioxidants actually has a negative effect on longevity. However, many studies by reputable institutions (such as the Mayo Clinic, Cleveland Clinic, and Johns Hopkins) have shown that helping others helps people live longer, better lives. Simply being socially active with a caring group of friends has also been shown to increase health (both physical and mental).

At Westminster there are ample opportunities to be involved and to help others. Attending worship or educational activities is the simplest way to be involved. If you want to do more, there are a myriad of ways to be involved, such as assisting in the work of church committees or participating in one or more of the many mission programs. For instance, our Carpenter's Shelter program is in need of an assistant leader to help organize the monthly dinners when the leader is unavailable. The annual Rebuilding Together Alexandria service day is on April 29. Westminster has been providing a team for many years. All skill levels are welcomed. 



Robert Calhoun will address some of the "hot button" issues that were





As has occurred during the last four years, Virginia Governor Terry McAuliffe and the Republican-controlled legislature continue to be at loggerheads on some salient policy issues confronting the Commonwealth. Although agreement was reached on some legislative actions, other issues continue to remain contentious. There will be races for three statewide offices – the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Attorney General – as well as for all 100 House of Delegates seats. There have also been actions taken by the U. S. Supreme Court concerning Congressional and legislative redistricting in Virginia.

Bob is an attorney with the law firm of Redmon, Peyton and Braswell, LLP, in Alexandria, Virginia, specializing in government relations, transportation, planning, and zoning. He is currently a member of the Virginia Code Commission. He was selected as Director of the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority, serving from 1998-2003.

Bob was elected to the Alexandria City Council on the Republican ticket, serving three two-year terms. In 1984, Bob ran again for a vacant seat on the City Council and served until December 1988, when he was elected to the Virginia State Senate. He represented the people of the 30th Senate District, which included most of Alexandria and portions of Fairfax County, until 1995.

Bob Calhoun earned his Bachelor of Arts degree at Tufts University and is a graduate of Yale Law School. He was born and grew up in Oak Park, Illinois. Bob and his wife Sandy are longtime residents of Alexandria as well as active members of Westminster.

For the sixth year, the Community Grant program seeks to award local nonprofits who aid Northern

Virginia residents. The grant represents an opportunity to both enhance support of current church partners and develop new relationships among area non-profits. Funding for the Community Grant Program comes from the Local Mission Committee's budget and through pledges and donations given by individuals during December's Alternative Giving Bazaar.

The Westminster Community Grant is intended to provide area charitable organizations with one-time financial assistance for non-operational expenses. This could include an element required to start a new project, or an unanticipated expense that if fulfilled can bring an existing project to a new level. Westminster focuses its local mission efforts around Children, Hunger, Education, Shelter and Self-Sufficiency; all applying organizations must demonstrate the project's support of services linked to at least one of these areas.
